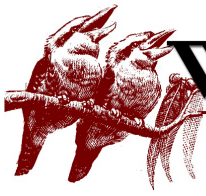

Educational items for students to own (YEAR 3) ONLY

At Watsonia North Primary we have successfully run our 1:1 Netbook program for several years now for students in Years 3 to 6. Please note the 2024 information booklet about the program including rationale, expectations and requirements was distributed to 2023 Year 2 parents last year.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

\$User-Pays basis

Watsonia North Primary School offers a range of items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides in order to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis. These items/activities such as camps, incursions, excursions, sports and school photos are provided on a user-pays basis. Associated costs are published on Compass on a termly basis or prior to a specific event, where payment and consent are provided by parents. For our Year 3/4 cohort we estimate this to be approximately **\$410?** per child for 2024. We also offer an instrumental program which is delivered during school hours and costs are dependent on instrument learned and lesson taken. Fees are paid directly to instrumental teacher.

STUDENTS IN 3/4 WHO ARE IN CHOIR:

- Bus fares for Eisteddfods and other performances (app \$15 per trip) – further details to be sent home during the year.
- State school Spectacular - \$30 app
- School of Rock - \$20 app

Fundraising

Parents and Friends Association hold events throughout the year which include bookclub, raffles, etc. A major fundraiser may be considered by the Parents and Friends Association, to be held at some stage during the year, eg Fun Run, Jump Rope for Heart.

Social Services

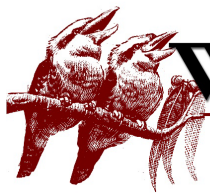
Several small fundraising efforts will be run throughout the year. These events will support foundations such as The Cancer Council, The Royal Children's Hospital and other charities as determined by the Student Representative Council.

There will be a maximum of one out of uniform day per term, which usually requires a gold coin donation of \$1 or \$2 for social services.

Financial Support for Families

Watsonia North Primary understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund. Families holding a valid means-tested concession card are eligible for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) that provides payments for eligible students to attend Extra-Curricular (OPTIONAL) Items and Activities. The CSEF is an annual payment



- to the school to be used towards camps and term expenses (incursions, excursions & events) for the benefit of the eligible student - 2024 primary school student rate is \$150.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
